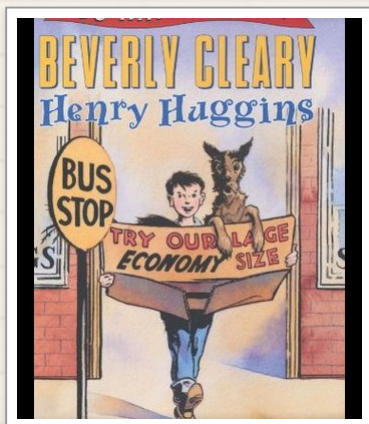


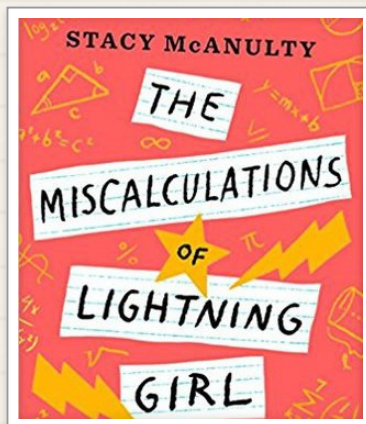

How does a virtual book club work?

1. Each week I will be posting read aloud chapters of our library website under Virtual Book Club.
2. Simply go to that page and click on the chapters you want to listen to. Listen along (you can

even listen with parents and siblings!)

3. Each Friday at 2:00 (for K-2) and 2:45 for (3rd-4th) you can click on the Teams link for your book club and meet me, your school friends, teachers, friends and family for a short discussion on the chapters of that week. Meetings will be 30 min.

Book Club K-2nd Grade

Our book for K-2nd is Henry Huggins. This is the first novel written by Newbery Award winning Beverly Cleary. This heartwarming story introduces us to Henry and the loveable dog Ribsy. Henry complains that nothing interesting ever happens and then along comes Ribsy and the two become best friends. But what will happen to the duo when Ribsy's original owner shows up? All ages are sure to enjoy this classic!

I will post read aloud videos on Mondays, Tuesdays and Wednesdays during the weeks of Sept. 14th, 21st and 28th.

Our book club virtual meetings will take place on Sept. 18th, Sept. 25th and Oct. 2nd from 2:00-2:30.

Book Club 3rd-4th Grade

The book for the 3rd and 4th grade book club is Stacy McAnulty's The Miscalculations of Lightning Girl. Lucy is a little different than her middle school peers, when she was a young girl she was struck by lightning, and while she wasn't hurt the strike left her with genius level math skills. Since the lightning strike she has been home schooled and even though she is only 12 she is technically ready for college. Her grandmother tells her that before she can head to college she has to go to one year of middle school, make one friend, join one activity and read one book that isn't a math textbook. Can Lucy do it? Will she survive middle school and all its perils? This is a wonderful story of being a little bit different and not fitting in with the crowd.

I will post read aloud videos on Mondays, Tuesdays and Wednesdays during the weeks of Sept. 14, 21st, 28th, Oct. 5th, Oct. 12th. (I will post read alouds during fall break but feel free to listen to those chapters during the week of Oct. 12th if you would like to take a break).

Our book club virtual meetings will be Sept. 18th, 25th, Oct. 2, and Oct. 16th. (We will NOT have a meeting during the fall break week). We will meet from 2:45-3:15.

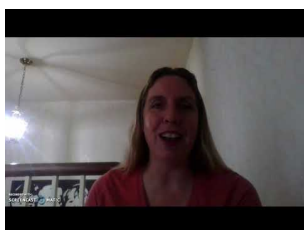
